


Figure 1. Countries or areas with reported confirmed cases of COVID-19, 11 May 2020 from WHO sitrep

Figure 1: Cases by age group





Figure 4: Cases by date of confirmation

Figure 3: Cases by clinical presentation




## WHO Support to the Reinforcement of Continuum of Care in Public Hospitals

During the current COVID-19 outbreak, WHO is collaborating with the MOPH and other health partners to strengthen Lebanon's public healthcare system and reinforce its limited operational capacity. WHO is reinforcing the access to essential health services and supporting the intensive care capacity through procurement of relevant and life-saving ICU equipment. A total of 19 ventilators and 9 mobile X-rays were already procured and delivery is ongoing to the designated public hospitals. In addition, 4 cardiac monitors with a central monitoring station were procured by WHO and delivered to Rafik Hariri University Hospital to support the isolation ward.

WHO will be also supporting healthcare services in the hard to reach areas in the country. In this regard, a project is under preparation to accelerate the capacity expansion of the 11 governorate public hospitals spread across different geographical areas.

This project will increase access to healthcare, particularly COVID-19 care, for the most vulnerable population groups across the country, and improve Lebanon's public healthcare COVID-19 management and surveillance system. The project is based on the care model for COVID-19 on Figure 1 below.

The project will contribute to the resilience and coping capacities of the most vulnerable patients and their families, through facilitating access to basic essential and life-saving services to decrease morbidity and health complications, and avoid further impoverishment caused by COVID-19.

WHO in collaboration with relevant stakeholders will continue to work on strengthening Lebanon's public healthcare system in order to mitigate the impact of the current pandemic and ensure the preparedness of the country for future public health emergencies while safeguarding equity for vulnerable populations.
