#### **ESC**

- According to the ILO-UNRWA NBC rapid socio-economic survey undertaken in September 2007
  - 79% of the displaced population declared themselves unemployed
- This lack of jobs imposed a threat to the stability and security of NBC and all surrounding areas

ILO/UNRWA established 2 Employment Service Centers : NBC and BC

- The ESC team:
  - Supervisor
  - 2 counselors
  - 1 outreach
  - 2 registration clerks

- 2 capacity building trainings
- Basic activities on the employment services
- Software data base training



# Objectives of the ESC

- Collect analyze and distribute information on the local labor market
- Identify employment and training opportunities, with major projects, NGOs or private sector employers

- Facilitate the linkage to employers and vocational training institutions
- Undertake job matching and job placement
- Provide jobseekers with up to date advice and assistance on vocational training and employment opportunities available in the local labor market (career guidance, counseling and placement)

# Specific duties

- Registering and interviewing jobseekers for employment
- Referring jobseekers to appropriate vacancies
- Encouraging employment of both gender and people with disabilities
- Monitoring the labor market and collecting information from employers and VET providers
- Receiving vacancies from employers and VET providers

# Wide spectrum of beneficiaries

- Skilled labour looking for jobs or wishing to revive or expand small businesses
- Unskilled workers who are offering their labour or wishing to upgrade their skills for quality employment
- Vulnerable groups such as women and people with disabilities

- VET map January 2009
- Rapid Assessment of the labour market demands - April 2009
- According to the findings:
  - vet providers have been contacted to provide proposals and offers accordingly.
  - private sector has been contacted to provide proposals and offers in connection to direct on job training and placement after the training.
- At this stage ToRs and Service contracts are being prepared as needed.

# ILO role in MDG fund for peace building and conflict prevention

- Implement tripartite dialogue workshop on labour right for Palestinian and Lebanese
- Conduct participatory Value Chain Analysis for the key local economic sectors in each of the selected border communities
- Develop a local strategy to promote micro and small enterprises, particularly among youth and women

- Enhance one Micro Finance Institution financial services to local entrepreneurs and cooperatives
- Develop and update an employment and livelihood monitoring tool package
- Provide a multi-disciplinary livelihood support package including business management training, loans and in kind support to women and men

### Other activities

Socio economic assessment in Nahr el Bared Surrounding areas in collaboration with UNDP and conducted by CRI (consultation and Research institute)

#### Livelihood sector

- Participatory planning and monitoring of livelihood interventions
- ILO is co chairing the Livelihood cluster with UNRWA, with an increasing number of participants mainly in employment services and SME support

- Empowerment of the National Employment Offices through
  - Purchasing necessary equipments for a better functioning of the 3 existing offices
  - Developing a data base software
  - Training of the staff on the employment services operations

### The PVCA Workshop

- Conducted by UNDP and ILO
- in collaboration with LPDC, UNRWA, UN-HABITAT
- Workshop addressing the construction sector in North Lebanon.
- Around 100 stakeholders participated in the workshop.
- Based on the information collected, the team
  - diagnosed weaknesses and strengths of the construction sector
  - elaborated recommendations and proposals
     to improve the value chain performance and competitiveness
- proposals that have already found support:
  - vocational training for needed professions in the construction sector
  - skills development for local contractors,
  - provision of guarantee funds.
