Statement of Work to Conduct a Rapid Education Risk Analysis (RERA) for Lebanon's Education Sector

I. BACKGROUND

Under the USAID-funded Quality Instruction Towards Access and Basic Education Improvement (QITABI) 3 Activity, Research Triangle Institute (RTI) is seeking the services of a local consultant/s to conduct an education situation analysis. QITABI 3 is a 5-year Activity that aims to, in collaboration with the Ministry of Education and Higher Education (MEHE) and Center for Educational Research and Development (CERD), improve the national-level service delivery of inclusive education and improve instruction resulting in gains in literacy, numeracy, and social—emotional skills across all grades.

II. SCOPE OF WORK

The situation analysis will utilize USAID's Rapid Education Risk Analysis (RERA) toolkit. The consultant will carry out the situation analysis in close collaboration and partnership with RTI Lebanon and RTI Home Office team, who will provide technical support and review the deliverables.

The RERA is a rapid but comprehensive situation analysis of educational institutions, learners, and communities, treating them as a dynamic network of relationships encompassing assets and various contextual risks. It includes essential components from rapid education needs assessment along with contextual risk analyses like conflict analysis, disaster risk assessment, and resilience analysis. The primary focus of a RERA is to: (1) examine the impact of risks on the school community; (2) determine the reciprocal influence of education on risks; and (3) analyze how different contextual risks influence each other.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the situational analysis is to investigate how contextual risks, such as the financial crises, school closures resulting from teacher strikes; and insecurity and volatile context in the country have impacted education. The research will investigate:

- (1) Broader contextual risks to education;
- (2) Groups affected by those risks;
- (3) Existing resilience and coping strategies among different groups, offering chances to strengthen community resilience; and
- (4) Opportunities to address risks, building self-reliance and promoting sustainable solutions that draws on local culture and norms.

The situation analysis will build on QITABI 2's RERA conducted in 2020 in response to the pandemic. The end-product of this consultancy is an extensive analysis report aimed at bolstering the Lebanon's path to self-reliance. It will focus on enhancing the education system and addressing the factors impacting the education outcomes, thereby mitigating programmatic, fiduciary, and institutional risks.

RESEARCH QUESTIONS



Below are research questions that will serve as a starting point for the RERA:

- How has the crisis or emergency affected access to and availability of education for different population groups? What kind of barriers have prevented vulnerable children such as girls or children with disabilities, from accessing education?
- How have actors at different levels (macro [ministries, organizations, donors], meso [local NGOs, teacher training programs, community groups] and micro [schools, home]) responded to different crises since 2020?
- What is the status of teaching and learning materials, curriculum delivery, and teacher training? How has the financial crisis impacted the quality of education, including the availability of qualified teachers?
- Which groups of learners are most vulnerable during the financial crisis, and what are their specific needs? Do any displaced populations or children with disabilities require specific support?
- What protection risks do children face in the education environment during the crisis?
 (e.g., gender-based violence, child recruitment). Are safe learning spaces and mechanisms in place to protect children from harm?
- To what extent are education services continuing during the crisis? What alternative education modalities are being used, and how effective are they?
- What is the condition of education infrastructure, including schools and learning facilities? Have schools been damaged or repurposed for other uses during the crisis?
- How are local communities and parents involved in supporting education during the crisis? Are community-based initiatives in place to ensure education continuity?
- What is the capacity of the government and education authorities to respond to the education needs of affected populations? What policies or measures have been put in place to address education risks?
- What are the potential long-term effects of the crisis on the education system and the prospects of learners?
- Are follow-up mechanisms being used so that the trainings and implementation are carried out in meaningful ways to ensure the safety of all children?

Sample:

The sample will encompass a representative group of key informants from various education stakeholders, formal and non-formal, including:

- Officials from the MEHE and CERD along with heads of departments, academic specialists, coaches, and trainers.
- Education personnel from both public and private schools, including principals, teachers, and administrators.
- Students across all grades from both public and private schools, with a specific focus on displaced population.
- Representatives from the low-cost schools' associations and non-formal education

Regional Representation:

To promote inclusivity, key informants will be selected to represent various regions, ensuring regional diversity. Each governorate, including Mount Lebanon, Beirut, Nabatieh/South Lebanon, North Lebanon/Akkar, and Baalbek-Hermel, will have proportionate representation.



This approach will capture the nuances and challenges of different regions for a comprehensive understanding of the education landscape across different regions.

LEVEL OF EFFORT AND TIMELINE

This consultancy is scheduled to be carried out from mid-December 2023 to March 2024, with the Level of Effort distributed over a maximum of 30 working days.

LOCATION

The consultancy and associated work are planned to take place in Lebanon. In-country presence is strongly advised to effectively carry out the tasks and engage with the local context.

Qualifications required:

- Minimum of five years' experience in leading and conducting a study.
- Experience and expertise in basic education with a strong understanding of education in conflict and crisis environments.
- Established relationships with networks, research/academic institutions, and implementing organizations in the field of research, conflict analysis, and gender equality.
- Knowledge of risk assessment, context analysis, situation analysis methodologies.
- Strong knowledge of USAID programs.

Skills required:

- Ability to write high-quality technical documents in Arabic and English.
- Ability to conduct literature search and desk reviews involving academic and grey literature.
- Ability and experience in conducting primary data collection (should this be needed).
- Skilled in working under pressure in high-risk situations within fragile states in MENA.
- Skilled in working in a collaborative, multicultural environment involving multiple stakeholders.
- Fluency in written and spoken Arabic and English; master's degree in a related field.

- 1. **Procurement Narrative Description**: The Buyer (RTI) intends to purchase commodities and/or services identified in Attachment A. The term of the Ordering Agreement shall be from Award Date to the Delivery date of the Offeror unless extended by mutual agreement of the parties. The Buyer intends to award to a single "approved' supplier based on conformance to the listed specifications, the ability to service this contract, and selling price. We reserve the right to award to more than one bidder. If an Ordering Agreement is established as a result of this RFQ/RFP, the supplier understands that quantities indicated in the specifications (Attachment A) are an estimate only and RTI does not guarantee the purchase quantity of any item listed.

- 3. Proposal Requirements. All Sellers will submit a quote/proposal which contains offers for all items and options included in this RFQ/RFP. All information presented in the Sellers quote/proposal will be considered during RTI's evaluation. Failure to submit the information required in this RFQ/RFP may result in Seller's offer being deemed non-responsive. Sellers are responsible for submitting offers, and any modifications, revisions, or withdrawals, to reach RTI's office designated in the RFQ/RFP by the time and date specified in the RFQ/RFP. Any offer, modification, revision, or withdrawal of an offer received at the RTI office designated in the RFQ/RFP after the exact time specified for receipt of offers is "late" and may not be considered at the discretion of the RTI Procurement Officer. 6. **Notifications and Deliveries**: Time is of the essence for this procurement. Seller shall deliver the items or services no later than the dates set forth in the contract that will be agreed by both parties as a result of this RFQ/RFP. The Seller shall immediately contact the Buyer's Procurement Officer if the specifications, availability, or the delivery schedule(s) changes. Exceptional delays will result in financial penalties being imposed of Seller.



- 7. **Documentation**: The following documents will be required for payment for each item:
 - (a) A detailed invoice listing Purchase Order Number, Bank information with wiring instructions (when applicable)
 - (b) Packing List
 - (c) All relevant product/service documentation (manuals, warranty doc, certificate of analysis, etc.)
- 8. - 9. **Alternative Proposals**: Sellers are permitted to offer "alternatives" should they not be able to meet the listed requirements. Any alternative proposals shall still satisfy the minimum requirements set forth in Attachment A Specifications.
- 10. **Inspection Process**: Each item shall be inspected prior to final acceptance of the item. All significant discrepancies, shortages, and/or faults must be satisfactorily corrected and satisfactorily documented prior to delivery and release of payment.
- 11. **Evaluation and Award Process:** The RTI Procurement Officer will award an agreement contract resulting from this solicitation to the responsible Seller (bidder) whose offer conforms to the RFQ/RFP will be most advantageous to RTI, price and other factors considered. The award will be made to the Seller representing the **best value** to the project and to RTI. For the purpose of this RFQ/RFP, price, delivery, technical and past performance are of equal importance for the purposes of evaluating, and selecting the "best value" awardee. RTI intends to evaluate offers and award an Agreement without discussions with Sellers. Therefore, the Seller's initial offer should contain the Seller's best terms from a price and technical standpoint. However, RTI reserves the right to conduct discussions if later determined by the RTI Procurement Officer to be necessary.

The evaluation factors will be comprised of the following criteria:

- (a) **PRICE**. Lowest evaluated ceiling price (inclusive of option quantities).
- (b) **<u>DELIVERY</u>**. Seller provides the most advantageous delivery schedule.
- (c) <u>TECHNICAL</u>. Items/Services shall satisfy or exceed the specifications described in RFQ/RFP Attachment A.
- (d) <u>PAST PERFORMANCE</u> Seller can demonstrate his/her capability and resources to provide the items/services requested in this solicitation in a timely and responsive manner.
- (e) OTHER EVALUATION CRITERIA.
- 12. **Award Notice**. A written notice of award or acceptance of an offer, mailed or otherwise furnished to the successful supplier within the time acceptance specified in the offer, shall result in a binding contract without further action by either party.



- 13. **Validity of Offer**. This RFP in no way obligates RTI to make an award, nor does it commit RTI to pay any costs incurred by the Seller in the preparation and submission of a proposal or amendments to a proposal. Your proposal shall be considered valid for <u>90</u> days after submission.
- 14. **Representations and Certifications.** Winning suppliers under a US Federal Contract are required to complete and sign as part of your offer RTI Representations and Certifications for values over \$10,000.
