<b>Evaluation Objectives</b>	<p>The purpose of the Evaluation Study is to measure the impact and effectiveness of 2 response projects in terms of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Improved access to safe and supportive environments of children and youth that were affected by Beirut blast (Beirut area);</li> <li>- Improved access to safe and supportive environments of children for returning to school after Covid-19 pandemic (Bekaa area)</li> </ul>

### 2. Background on the organization and the project

Right to Play (RTP) is a global organization committed to improving the lives of children and youth affected by conflict, disease and poverty. Established in 2000, Right to Play has pioneered unique play-based approach to learning and development which focuses on quality education, life skills, health, gender equality, child protection and building peaceful communities.

The Refugee Education in Emergencies (as response to Beirut blast and Covid-19) projects are implemented in Right to Play Lebanon in Beirut, the North and Bekaa governorates to improve access of children and youth to safe and supportive environments.

Activities implemented in the Beirut blast response project are rehabilitating a number of affected schools/education centers, distributing educational kits and tablets to educators and children, and training teachers on PSS play-based learning to implement sessions with affected children.

Direct reach of children and youth: 900

Activities implemented in the Covid-19 response project are improving WASH facilities at a number of schools/education centers in the North and Bekaa areas, distributing hygiene kits to households, and training teachers on PSS play-based learning to implement sessions with affected children.

Direct reach of beneficiaries: 2500

### 3. Evaluation Objectives

The evaluation aims at answering the following questions:

- To what extent have the projects contributed to their outputs and outcomes?
- Have the projects improved access to safe and supportive environments for targeted children and youth?
- Have the projects improved the overall psychosocial wellbeing of targeted children and youth?

### 4. Methodology and scope

The methodology will be a mix of quantitative and qualitative tools.

- Quantitative tools to measure children's wellbeing are already developed,
- Qualitative tools (FGD guiding questions, and interview questions for stakeholders) are to be developed by the consultant.

The sample size should be representative to the overall targeted population.

Enumerators are hired and trained by RTP (not to include in the consultant's budget proposal)

Anticipated number of working days for the consultancy is **40 days**.

## 6. Qualifications of the consultant

- Proven knowledge and experience in applying participatory research methods and tools;
- Degree in relevant field (e.g. Public Health, Social Sciences or any related technical field);
- Strong facilitation skills, particularly with regards to working with vulnerable groups;
- Demonstrated understanding and support of principles of equity, participation and inclusion;
- Good writing skills;
- Fluent spoken and written English and Arabic.

- Financial proposal (signed) that includes a budget for the expected activities and the per diem for each person involved in USD;
