2. Background on the organization and the project

Right to Play is a global organization committed to improving the lives of children and youth affected by conflict, disease and poverty. Established in 2000, Right to Play has pioneered unique play-based approach to learning and development which focuses on quality education, life skills, health, gender equality, child protection and building peaceful communities.

After Beirut blast on August 4, 2020, Right to Play modified and implemented play-based activities with psychosocial support (PSS) component with children and adolescents in affected areas.

Currently 2 PSS play-based projects are implemented with different approaches in Beirut:

- Project 1 provides group focused PSS activities, done in person and through an interactive play-application;
- Project 2 provides group PSS games with mindfulness activities through child-participatory approach and peer to peer interaction.

3. Research Objectives

This mixed method research study aims at exploring the impact of different components of the PSS play-based approaches on the wellbeing of participating children and adolescents.

It is important to note that a qualitative assessment was conducted in September 2020, by Right to Play and Plan International on the wellbeing of boys and girls affected by the Beirut blast. The later assessment can provide a base to the research to be developed.

4. Methodology and scope

A mixed method approach, consisting of qualitative and quantitative data is envisioned. The sample size should be representative to the overall targeted population that is 340 participants (140 in project 1, and 200 in project 2).

The research is expected to take place in parallel to the implementation of the 2 projects with several data collection points as needed. Data collection tools are expected to be play-based, and adapted to the age group of children/adolescents involved.

Anticipated number of working days for the consultancy is 25-30 days.

6. Qualifications of the consultant

- Masters or PhD degree in a relevant field (e.g., Psychology, Public Health, or Social Sciences);
- Demonstrated understanding and support of principles of equity, participation and inclusion;
- Good writing skills;
- Fluency in English and Arabic.

- Narrative proposal (2 pages) including overall plan for developing the research methodology, input on the suggested research design, capacity to deliver products as per the design described above and the roles of the team members or research partners' to be involved;
- Financial proposal that includes a budget for the expected activities and the per diem for each person involved in USD (or in LBP with an exchange rate to USD);
- MOF registration number if available;
- The financial proposal needs to be stamped and signed;
- CV of key persons involved and the portfolio of the organization if relevant.
